

REDISCOVERY OF THE ELEMENTS — GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATIONS OF SELECTED AUXILIARY SITES

The following table includes statues, plaques, memorials, etc., which are not directly connected with the discovery site (e.g., the home town of the discoverer). The information is arranged in alphabetical order, according to the pertinent scientist. The following information is given in five columns:

- **“Type of site” — Examples: Statue, plaque, school, building, street, etc.**
- **“Elements or Topic Involved” — Examples: Specific elements, chemical theory, etc.**
- **“Scientist” — Name of scientist.**
- **“Site location” — Complete description and address of site.**
- **“Lats/longs” — Latitude and longitude of site, given to 0.01 minute arc.**

Geographical coordinates of a particular geographical location, when appearing at different sites in "Rediscovery" may appear not to be consistent, but may be referring to different areas of that location. For example, the discovery of lutetium by Urbain is given as the Sorbonne at N48-50.86 E02-20.60, while the bust of Thénard is given at the Sorbonne at N48-50.94 E02-20.61; this is because the former is found at the historic chemistry wing at the rue Cujas side, while the latter is found at the Inner Courtyard, a distinct distance of 150 meters.

For one category, viz., "streets named after scientists," it would be impossible to list all; only a handful is included below, those which were observed in the normal perambulations of this project and which are usually near the other tabulated auxiliary sites.

Note: Some museums of a special nature are included, but the list is incomplete. For a complete register, see the table of Recommended Museums.
